Our VP Enrique Mendoza spearheaded an ambitious and highly effective system to help us connect with those in need, supplying them with food rations, medical equipment and other necessities while housebound.

We are a small but scrappy and dedicated team of volunteers, powered by two Google docs - one filled with items needed; other with items for donation. (We fill in any gaps with our own funds as well as your generous donations.)

We have also been doing Mon-Wed-Fri CPS food pickup and drop off for neighbors in need. Please add your name to the list without shame! We are in this together.

SWC In The News!



Curie Park Update

We are still working diligently behind the scenes to get some improvements made to Curie Park. If you haven't yet signed our petition, please do so, and share it with your network of friends and neighbors. It can be found at mailchi.mp/swcollective/curiepark

After much researching, cold calling and generally asking around, we found that the park is not the responsibility of the park district or the Public Building Commission...but CPS. We are now trying to get Ald. Ed Burke's assistance in connecting to the right folks at CPS. Recently we spoke with David Espinoza regarding the park, but have not received any follow up. Curie administration has not been able to engage Ald Burke either. Our next move? Gain 1,000 petition signatures and gather up a crowd to pay the alderman an in-person visit to press for progress. Would you consider joining us? There's power in numbers, after all.

Community Bike Rides




These bike rides are scheduled to happen on the first Saturday of each month, as long as no shelter-in-place orders are in effect.
